

Madonna Offer Vets Programs

As a result of recent amendments to the G.I. Bill increasing education benefits, veterans can now avail themselves of a "scholarship" worth about \$2,000 annually to attend the college or training program of their choice.

Veterans now enrolling in a full-time program at Madonna College, a coeducational institution in Livonia, will receive educational benefits of \$220 monthly. Veterans with dependents receive higher allowances.

All programs at Madonna College are fully approved by the Veterans Administration. The average cost of tuition for one year of full-time study is \$1,000, or \$35 per semester hour. Therefore, veterans in a full-time program would have more than \$1,000 remaining for living expenses. Madonna offers veterans additional financial aid, including loans and work-study programs.

Situated on 49 acres at 36600 Schoolcraft in Livonia, Madonna College offers degree programs for veterans in more than 20 majors. In addition to one, two and four-year programs in liberal arts, occupational and professional programs, continuing education is also available.

Veterans can enroll in professional education programs, which include criminal justice, radiologic technology, medical technology, nursing, social welfare, teacher education, fire protection technology, pre-law, pre-medicine and others. Nine two-year programs in allied health fields are offered.

Madonna gives veterans equivalency credit for education obtained while in military service and up to six hours credit for service experience.

Veterans are eligible for VA educational benefits if they have served at least 181 days of continuous active duty, any part of which occurred after Jan. 31, 1955, or were released from active duty after Jan. 31, 1955 for a service-connected disability. Service must have been terminated under conditions other than dishonorable.

Boating Course At Outdoorama

Free literature describing the work of the Coast Guard and various regulations will be available free at Outdoorama, the new sports, boat, camper and vacation show at the W. Eight Mile Armory, sponsored by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs.

Needy high school seniors who will enter private colleges in September must submit applications for the Michigan tuition grant program by March 2, according to Connie M. Knapp, director of financial aid at Mercy College of Detroit.

Students may receive up to \$1,200 for full-time attendance at an eligible private college or University in Michigan. Awards are made on the basis of financial need.

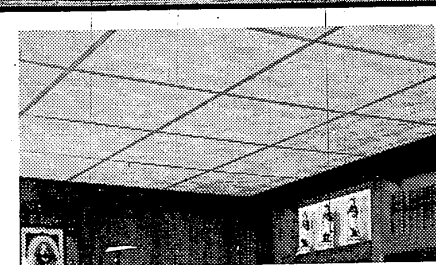

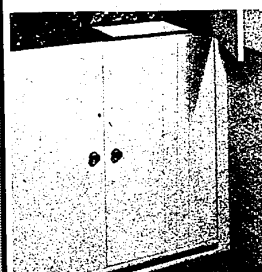

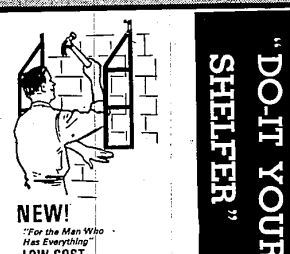
