

Safe Boating Classes Offered

Boating safety for youngsters aged 12-16 will be offered in area schools this winter by the marine safety division of the Wayne County Sheriff's Dept.

State law requires that persons from 12-16 years of age must possess a "safe boating certificate" in order to operate a motorboat of more than six horsepower. The certificate can be earned only by successfully completing the state-prescribed course.

To enroll, write to: Sgt. Frederick J. Reiman Jr., 3100 Henry Ruff, Westland, 48185. The free course consists of three sessions of two hours each, once a week for three weeks.

Topics include motorboat registration, safety equipment, life preservers, lights, capacity, traffic rules of the water, what to do in case of fire and accident, weather warnings, man-overboard procedures and water skiing rules.

Realtors Institute At Oakland U

Graduate realtors institute I and II are offered in accelerated daytime sessions by Oakland University's division of continuing education just prior to the March state realty examinations.

The institutes help to prepare new sales and broker personnel and provide established personnel the opportunity to fulfill education requirements.

GRI-I combined with preparation for the state salesmen's license examination, is March 19-22. GRI-II, including preparation for the broker's examination is March 26-29. All sessions are held in the Oakland Center building on the campus in Rochester.

Designed for those preparing for the examinations, a one-day math refresher on March 23 covers prorating taxes and insurance, figuring mortgage discounts and closing costs, and a brief review of basic math. Tuition is \$70 for each GRI course and \$15 for the math refresher. Advance registration and payment are required. Enrollees desiring overnight accommodations may obtain a discount rate when motel reservations are made through the division of continuing education office.
