Keep the money and or-ders right here at home, and it will not be long before you will see big-ger stores, bigger stocks, and a greatly incresed range of selection.

During the past thirty days the writer has received a few inquiries as to why the annual village report has not been published, some personally, other by mail. So far we have been unable to answer the question. A report of village re ceipts and disbursemen's is requir ed by law, and while I am quite sure that none of my questioners, asked the explanation, with any malicious intent, yet in view of the fact that an assessment has just been made totaling in excess of seven thousand dollars, at an increase over last year, they feel justified in asking where and why the money is being used.
