WILL LEVINGTON COMFORT

Magazine Writer and War Correspondent Will Write on Canadian Timber Prospects and Conditions.

Will Levington Comfort is a writer, widely known as a correspondent during the Philippine and Russo-Japanese and other military campaigns. He is now devoting his attention to one of the most vital and interesting questions of the day—timber lands.

He will write a series of articles on the timber lands, and will be made in the vast Canadian woodlands, yet virgin to the chain saw, and the smoke of timber camps.
