July 1915 Tax Notice
The July tax for the village of Farmington for the year 1915 became due on July 1, 1915, and is payable on or before July 31, 1915 at the office of J. R. Walters at the Walters confectionery and cigar store in the village.

Penalty of one per cent will be added August 1, 1915, and one per cent the first of each month thereafter, and on March 1, 1916, all unpaid village taxes for the year 1915 will be turned over to the county treasurer for collection with a 7 per cent collection fee added.

Bonus to Ford Owners

It will be no small task that will confront the Ford Motor company next month, in the distribution of the bonus of \$15,000,000 among Ford Owners, under the plan of giving a rebate of \$50.00 to each purchaser of a 1915 Ford. It will be necessary to make out 300,000 checks for \$50 each, these being mailed to car owners all over the country, and indeed, throughout the world. It was stated this week that the task of signing the checks alone, after the names of the payees are written in, would require the services of 30 men for a period of ten days. It is estimated that one man can sign 1,000 checks in a day, and the force of 30, working for ten days, would turn out the 300,000 checks.

A force of 30 stenographers will be needed to write in the names and address of the payees, it having been estimated that this work will take about six weeks. The checks five on a sheet, will be dated August 15, and drawn upon the Highland State bank. A machine will stamp the checks with the name of the company, and the pieces of paper will then be placed in envelopes with transparent fronts, showing the address of the payee, thus making it unnecessary to address the envelopes. The sealing and stamping of the envelopes will follow and they will then go into the mails, to return in time to the bank upon which they are drawn, their arrival entailing a large amount of work here.—Highland Park Times.
