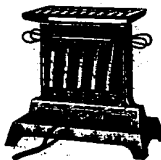

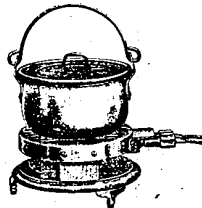

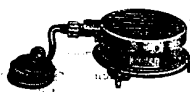

### The Cold Winter.

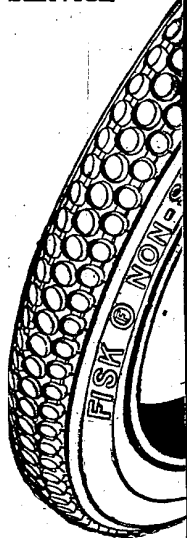
