Sec. 1 No persons or persons shall ride, operate, push or propel any bicycle, tricycle, cart of similar device on any of the sidewalks in the Viliage of Farmington. Sec. 2. Every person or persons who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance, shall on conviction thereof be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty days, or both such fine or imprisonment in the discretion of the court before whom conviction shall be had.
