#### Salem Evangelical

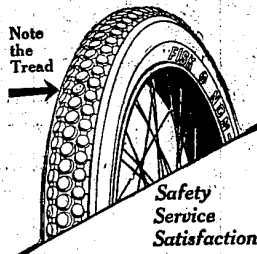
Rev. Stange will preach in the Clarenceville church next Sunday, December 15th, at 10:30 central standard time.
