HUNDRED YEARS OF AGRICULTURE.

With the advent of 1916, Michigan enters the centennial period of agricultural activities, and it is with pride that we review the wealth and prosperity that the tiller of the soil has contributed to the commonwealth.

Today, after one hundred years Today, after one hundred years of activity, we find Michigan still in its prime as an agricultural section. That our undeveloped acreage is being called into commission at the same rate that our population in creases is evident that farming it Michigan is as attractive as our manufacturing and commercial interests. The increasing farm pop-ulation is a sign that Michigan's growth is permanent in character, and by the same token, city and country life must hold equal advariences for those that choose to

Going back to the time when agriculture first began to add to our wealth as well as supply the necessities of life for the individual, we find the early pioneer taking his first load of wheat to the mill which was the first permanent in-stitution, the result of agriculture.

Michigan's agricultural activities began long before the advent of the eaper, when the flail was in fashion, and the steel plow point was yet unborn in the smithy's forge. That our agricultural pros-perity should begin to develop in the age of crude farming equipment and project its utility into the day of scientific farming is ample proof of its stability.
Stern necessity drove the early

Michigan farmer to plant a crop of utility—one that would provide food and ready money.

He took his wheat to the mill, returning with flour, middlings and and money, minus the miller's share. As his acres grew around his cahin in the wilderness, his after harvest visit to the miller was marked with a substantial increase in his cash assets. Thus Michigan's agricultural industry was built around the old grist mill.

The flour and grist mill was and is today the outpost of commerce in Michigan. Villages, towns and cities were never permanent until the foundation of the flour mill had been laid, and a ready permanent market for grain had been establish-

In Grand Rapids the mill stones from the first grist mill occupy a prominent position in one of the municipal parks, preserved as a treasured civic monument. The remains of the first salt, oil and ore adventures are only mentioned in history because they never contributed any tangible reward to the

The demand and consumption of flour from Michigan grown wheat is far in excess of the present supply. Until every farmer in-cludes wheat in his farming rotation he will not get the easiest dollar he

not have money to put in the bank before he returned home.
Today, entering the period that marks Michigan's Centennial in agriculture, let us bear in mind the fact, that we owe a debt of grati-tude to the old grist mill. To maintain our standing in the pro-duction of wheat and the consump-tion of flour milled in Michigan, is our first economic duty, so that when Michigan's agricultural his-tory, is written, 100 years hence, posterity will find itself amid pros-perity of the sound variety.
