For seven years Farmington was their post office. They resided in the state of Kentucky for 22 years, returning here in 1893, where he has since made his home.

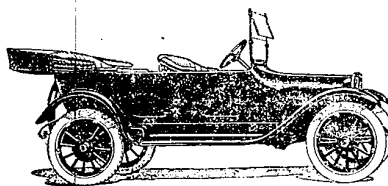
