broken and the flesh torn from an arm. More than half a dozen farmers in this county have been hurt during the past few weaks by falling from loads of produce either on the road or in leaving the barn Other instances are numerous.

All this goes to prove right at home the statement which sinvestigotors of the need for satety-first movements have found to be true, namely that a large percentage of he accidents occuring in industrial life are in agricultural pursuits.

This seems to point out the need for precautionary educational meas-ures among the rural population as well as among the employes of factories and big shops. Though the problem is not extremely simple in the city it is still less so in the the country, for while the city mployer can reduce the risks in

his shop to certain stated and definate circumstances, the farmer will find it hard to do so. Few accidents in the country occur under exactly the same set of circumstances, while in the factors the same sort of accidents usually come from the

same basic reason. However, a large share of the unfortunate occurences which cost life or limb in both city or country are due to carelessness fundament ally and a general compaign for cate and caution would do much good in either place.
