In the case of walleyed pike 25 may be taken in a day, with not more than 10 in your possession at any one time. In either case it is unlawful to buy or sell.

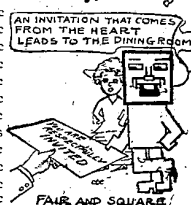
