INCREASING YIELD OF MILK

Two Quarts of Wheat Bran Morning and Evening Will Bring About Desired Results From Cows.

If the milk is sold it will pay to give If the milk is sold it will pay to give each cow two quarts of wheat bran morning and evening. Give a forkful of hay or straw to each the first thing in the morning, and after the hay is eaten the bran may be given. This method of feeding keeps the cows in good order, the milk yield is increased and there is less danger from bloat from eating wet clover. Another advantage from feeding bran comes

The small-top milk pail is a neces-sity in the production of clean milk. Dirty milk is more dangerous than dirty water because disease germs that would sterve in water will multiply rapidly in milk. When the dairy cow is fed just enough to maintain her body weight she cannot be expected to give much milk.
