The Quaker Family.

Now since Quakertown was among the earliest settlements and labored mightily in laying the foundations for present goodly conditions, the Elders and Leaders, Thomas and Harmon, Amos, Francis and divers others took council together as to what part, if any, they would take in the meeting, as it partook of a somewhat worldly character. Reasoning together they came to the belief that a picture of the simplicity and contentment of ye olden time would be an impressive lesson to the restless people of these latter days; so they builded a cabin of logs, such as was used by the pioneers, and Amos journeyed to the distant lakes and in the marshes nearby cut the long "Quaker grass" to thatch the roof thereof.

When it was finished, Frances and his wife and their children moved in and dwelt there for the day. Here a difficult day, the meeting was in Pontiac town; the meeting was in Pontiac town; much less a Quaker pioneer, was ever disturbed by a difficulty. 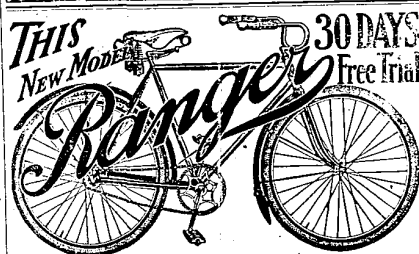
