Borgess Loses Scoring Marathon

Bishop Borgess head football Coach Fred Muschinski couldn't have been more pleased with his Spartans' offensive showing in their '73 finale with Centerline St. Clemens.

It was his defense's showing that ended Borgess' campaign on a sour note.

In a real donnybrook where 12 touchdowns and two field goals were scored, St. Clemens got the best of Borgess in overtime, 47-40.

It was a tough road for Borgess to go out on after almost upsetting Divine Child midway in the season, finishing second in the Catholic Double A and winding up with a 5-3 record.

The Borgess offensive show did produce two mile-stones in the running of Dan

Kelly and the passing of Greg Dryden. These two now hold every record possible in their respective talents at Borgess High.

The 5-10, 175-pound Kelly rushed for 108 yards against St. Clemens to push his season mark over the 1,000 yards. It is 1,003 yards to be exact, along with 14 touchdowns.

The 5-11, 175-pound quarterback Dryden hit on 13 of 20 passes to conclude his '73 aerial assault at 61 completions in 116 attempts for 1,183 yards, 10 touchdowns and only six interceptions.

Borgess scored the first time it got the ball on the fifth play of the game with Devon McCarthy hauling in a

29-yard pass from Dryden and Tom Birney converting.

St. Clemens came right back on a 30-yard TD run by Dennis Kieleszewski and a conversion by Terry Delamelleure to make it 7-7.

After an exchange of fumbles, Birney faked a field goal and tossed a five-yard touchdown pass to Mike Milosch. The point after was blocked and with 15 seconds remaining in the first quarter, it was Borgess 13, St. Clemens 7.

Greg Chranowski climbed the next Clemens drive with a one-yard plunge making good a 60-yard march. The conversion again pushed them by Borgess, 14-13.

Borgess then took over on

its 37 and in seven plays scored with a 41-yard pass from Dryden to McCarthy setting up a two yard burst by Kelly. A Dryden to Kelly pass was good for a two-point play and Borgess was up, 21-14.

But St. Clemens bounced back with an 80-yard march in five plays with Chranowski scoring on a 40-yard spurt. The kick after was wide to make it 21-20, Borgess still on top.

Birney split the uprights from 35 yards out to increase the Borgess margin to 24-20 at the half.

St. Clemens again spurred ahead early in the third on a 39-yard run by Delamelleure, 27-24. Birney then missed on a 50-yard field

goal attempt and Clemens came back with Chranowski scoring on a one-yard plunge. Birney batted down a two-point pass attempt but Borgess found itself down, 33-24, the widest margin of the contest.

Kelly capped a 63-yard 12-play drive for Borgess early in the fourth on a two-yard burst to slice it to 33-31. Borgess defensive end Tom Kerr then caused a fumble with Birney scooping it up and dashing 25 yards for another Borgess score. The conversion was blocked but the Spartans were back on top, 37-33.

A Chranowski to Dave Sassin five-yard TD pass highlighted a 10-play 52-yard drive by St. Clemens to put

them back on top, 40-37, 2:20 remaining.

With 18 seconds showing on the clock, Birney did his thing, split the uprights from 33 yards away to tie it at 40-40. His was Birney's seventh good kick of 10 attempts for '73. He has also made good 21 of 25 conversions. The four misses were all blocked.

Borgess won the loss in overtime and elected to go on the defense first. St. Clemens scored on a third down and seven pass play from Chranowski to Delamelleure.

It was then Borgess' turn and Kelly drove for six, two and on a third down and two for a score, he fumbled and that was the '73 finale.

Stevenson Roars By Thurston, 18-0

The Stevenson High football machine has found a second life.

After winning their '73 opener over Redford Union, Jack Reardon's Stevenson crew proceeded to drop five straight before waking up and crushing Waterford, 29-0.

Stevenson continued its assault against Thurston and

the Spartans have amassed in the last two games more points than they collected in games one through six.

The Spartans topped Thurston, 18-0, for their third victory in eight outings, with city rival Churchill on tap this Friday at 3 p.m. on the Spartan gridiron.

"We are ready for them

(Churchill)," commented Reardon who has seen his club come to life the past two weeks.

The Spartans sparkled against Thurston with five pass interceptions which led to the Eagles' second straight defeat and fifth in eight games.

Stevenson received the

opening kickoff and a 62-yard Thurston right late in the second quarter halted a drive that was started by a Mark Terby interception, a drive that racked up 51 yards and Lulek pounding out 44 yards of it.

O'Keefe got Stevenson on the board again in the final

quarter with a 43-yard pass interception romp, giving the Spartans a 12-0 advantage.

Another stry Thurston pass set up a score with John Bowby hauling in an interception and dashing 44 yards for six points. The point after was blocked but the lead increased to 18.
