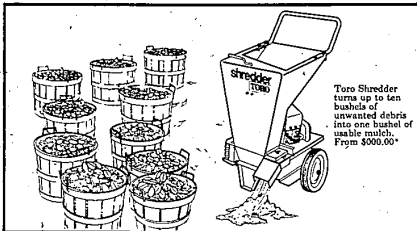
Hurst, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Hurst of 35804

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS BY THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS, MICHIGAN AND RIGHT OF REFERENDUM THEREON

TO ALL ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS, MICHIGAN:

TAKE NOTICE that the City Council of the City of Farmington Hills intends to issue Industrial Development Revenue Bonds of the City in the principal amount not exceeding Two Million Three Hundred Thousand (\$2,300,000.00) Dollars maturing up to twenty-five years from issuance at an interest rate not in excess of 7 per cent per annum, for the purpose of financing the cost of acquiring an industrial building and site therefor now owned by the White Motor Corporation and the constructing of improvements thereto together with the acquisition of machinery and equipment therefor, as defined in Act No. 62, Public Acts of Michigan, 1963, as amended, and costs incidental to the issuance of said bonds. Said industrial building and improvements together with necessary site and machinery and equipment therefor will be leased to White Motor Corporation, an Ohio corporation.

SOURCE OF PAYMENT

Said bonds will be issued in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 62, Public Acts of Michigan, 1963, as amended. Said bonds and the principal and interest thereon will not be a general obligation of the City of Farmington Hills and will in no event be payable from any tax revenues or other general funds of the City of Farmington Hills, but will be payable solely and only from payments to be received from White Motor Corporation, and other revenues, if any, derived from said industrial building and improvements together with necessary site and machinery and equipment therefor.

RIGHT OF REFERENDUM

This notice is given to and for the benefit of the electors of the City of Farmington Hills, in order to inform them that said bonds will be issued without submitting the question of their issuance to the electors of the City, unless within 45 days from the publication of this notice, a petition signed by not less than 5 per cent of the registered electors of the City, requesting a referendum upon the question of the issuance of said bonds, is filed with the City Clerk of the City, in which event the bonds will not be issued unless and until approved by a majority of the electors of the City voting thereon at a general or special election.

THIS NOTICE is given by order of the City Council of the City of Farmington Hills, Michigan, pursuant to the requirements of Section 12 of Act No. 62, Public Acts of Michigan, 1963, as amended.
