## Lawn Pests Resist

icidal sprays.

Just as resistant strains of the housefly developed after DDT was used everywhere, so have some lawn pests, such as webower and Japanese beetle grubs, acquired immunity in certain areas to chlordane or other insecticides.

In some cases the resistant strain experiences a population explosion, the pesticide killing predators but no longer the pest.

A similar situation seems to occur with turf diseases, some of which are no longer controlled by formerly effective tungicides.

Apparently fungi, too, compete, and when a susceptible fungus is controlled by other resistant to the fungicide may flourish better tiflan ever. As useful as the long-lasting systemic fungicides are in stopping stripe smut and dollarspot, leafspot disease frequently becomes more severe where they are used!

One of the safest as well as most effective means; for fighting lawn diseases, is to use grass varieties bred for disease-resistance. Aside from godd looks, disease-resistance is the characteristic most sought for in lawngrass breeding programs.

It all began with Merion, which, even after many years of widespread planting, still does not succumb to leafspot.

More recent highly-touted bluegrasses tolerant of most diseases are Adelphi, Baron, Bonnieblue, Fylking, Galaxy, Nugget, Pennstar, Sodco and Sydsport. Others such as Arboretum, Arista and Praor are momentarily attacked but recover well.

Starting a lawn with today's handsome, disease-resistant varieties should reduce up-keep. Sod of such selections will not ordinarily require fungicidal sprays.

Small green or brown sucking leafhoppers are becoming increasingly damaging this year.

They breed in the grass and can be seen flying about as the grass is disturbed. Most of our ornamentals (trees, shrubs, and flowers) are being damaged this year.

On maples it is often called leafhopper burn. They are rather small but can be seen flying about when leaves or branches are disturbed.

CONTROL: Spray foliage of trees, shrubs, and flowers covering upper and lower surfaces with 57°c Emulsifiable Malathion two teaspoons per gallon, plus two tablespoons per gallon, one 50°c. Wettable Sevin. Diazinon may be used in place of Malathion for slightly longer residual action.
