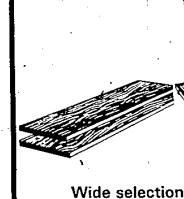

Seniors Get Break On Sport License

Michigan residents 65 or older will this year be able to purchase hunting and fishing sportsman licenses at about 75 per cent less than younger residents will be charged. The license fee break for senior citizens, authorized by recent legislation, sets the

sportsman license fee for those 65 and older at \$5.50. The same legislation that created the special fee for older residents, however, provided that the sportsman license fee for residents younger than 65 be increased from \$18.50 to \$22.50.

Arbitration Settles OU Pact

Oakland University and University Professors have resolved 1973-74 contract differences through binding arbitration.

Findings of the three-member panel include a 4.7 per cent pay increase and an incremental step in increase for the 283 continuing faculty. The raise and step increase bring total compensation to 7.8 per cent. Additional cost to OU for 1973-74 will be \$309,000, the university said.

The OU panel members were Frederick W. Obeare, academic vice president and provost, representing the university, and James McKay, mathematics, representing the AAUP. The third member, selected by both parties, was Charles Rehms, co-director of the Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations at the University of Michigan. The binding arbitration method of settling unresolved issues was agreed upon by both parties last year.

In other findings, the panel kept the student-faculty ratio at the current 20.6 students for each faculty member, approved six paid professional development leaves for librarians during each contract year, and found that no specific library book fund expenditure should be included as part of a 1973-74 contract agreement.

The panel began meeting on the issues June 8, as provided in a three year agreement signed between OU and the AAUP in 1972-73.

Telephone Magic Show On 5 Days

Displays describe the magic behind dialing, show what happens when phone service is ordered, "explain direct dial savings, and show more than 300 items an installer carries."
