Experienced Offense Should Help Harrison

Team balance and an improved offense are two factors which should make Farmington Harrison a winner in the '73 football campaign.

Harrison, which finished 3-6 last season, was outscored, 125 to 66. Head Coach John Herrington is working with 13 returning lettermen, five of whom are returning from the starting ranks.

Those five are co-captain senior Paul Bey, juniors Sam Pink and Dave Thorne and seniors Don Siekas and Dave Wallington.

The other co-captain is starting quarterback senior Mike Crudele, checking in at 5-11 and 175 pounds and working the monster-man slot on defense.

Herrington's improved offense is headed by the Hawk backfield.

Tim Turney is a 6-1, 200-pound up-back and Chuck Yarker a 5-11, 170-pound junior tailback who started the first two games last year before suffering an injury that sidelined him the remainder of the year.

Joining Crudele, Turney and Yarker in the backfield is 5-10, 165 senior running back Dave Thorne.

The offensive line sports 5-11, 183 pound Tim Hammer, 5-10, 185 pound Tim Hammer, 5-10, 185 pound Len Deluca, 6-2, 188 pound Paul Bey and 6-2, 220 pound Dave Wallington.

Wide receiver will be third year varsity performer Don Siekas at 5-11 and 170 pounds and tight end is junior 5-11, 165 pound Steve Moraver.

The defensive line which Coach Herrington has tabbed "inexperienced" is headed by nose guard Newson. The tackle berth is a three-way scramble between Wallington and 6-1, 210 pound junior Carl Braun and 5-9, 225 pound junior Wally Kurzeta who was All Western Six heavyweight wrestling champion last year as a sophomore.

Bay and Hammer hold down the defensive end slots.

In the secondary will be 5-10, 155 pound Jim Savage along with Thorne, Siekas and Crudele with Pink and Turney at linebacker.

Turney will also be handling the punting chores. The senior kicker averaged 34 yards a punt last year. Place-kicking will be 6-6, 255 pound Jim Harkin.

Churchill has to be the favorite again," commented Herrington who was dumped by the champs last season, 23-0. "But Mott and we could pull off a big surprise."

Harrison opens its campaign at Farmington on Saturday, Sept. 15 and the Western Six competition kicks off at Waterford Mott Sept. 28.

Herrington's coaching staff is rounded out by Bob Sutter with the line; Bob Sallow with the linebacks and ends; and Tom Shalla and Tom Evans with the junior varsity.

Although there's only an average amount of blood and guts, not a whole lot of profanity and obscenity and no sex, there is something entertaining about "The Stone Killer."

This viewer is inclined to think it's Charles Bronson who is cast as the bad guy in the white hat in this Michael Winner film.

The scenes are present-day New York and Los Angeles. Bronson is the tough cop who spends time in bobby traps trying to fit together pieces of a puzzle composed of underworld figures.
