More Schools Settle For Flat Pay Hikes

Contract settlements among teachers in local school districts appear to be settling a new pattern as teachers settle for flat across the board salary increases.

In recent years, teachers have generally settled for contracts with smaller percentages increase at the bottom of the seniority scale and higher percentages at the top.

In Overland, teachers in Farmington, Southfield and Redford Union have settled for across - the - board increases plus increments.

Teachers in Garden City and Clarenceville settled for the smaller percentage at the bottom of the scale and larger at the top.

Livonia and South Redford teacher groups are still negotiating. Teachers in Plymouth and Wayne - Westland are entering the final year of multi-year contracts and thus weren't faced with negotiations this year.

Southfield teachers recently settled for a five per cent across - the - board salary hike plus increments. This brought the total increase to nine per cent.

Increases are automatic salary increases based on length of service and increased education.

Southfield signed a two-year agreement which provides for a minimum across - the - board increase of three per cent and a maximum of six per cent in the second year. The exact percentage will depend on the increase in the consumer price index.

Although Farmington teachers haven't ratified their contract, the agreement calls for a 5.6 per cent increase plus increments.

The three-year contract calls for a cost of living increase between 3.5 and six per cent in the second and third years.

Redford Union teachers reached agreement on a one-year contract calling for a flat five per cent increase plus increments.

In contrast, teachers from Garden City and Clarenceville didn't settle for general percentage increases.

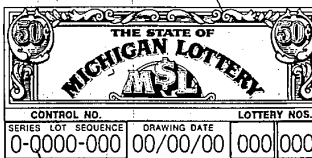
After a four-day strike, Garden City teachers agreed on a one-year contract calling for 5.55 per cent increase for beginners with bachelor degrees and a 7.62 increase for veterans with master's.

Clarenceville's agreement averages 7.3 per cent but varies for teachers depending on where they are in the increment scale.

The salary improvement averages 4.7 per cent while increments average 2.6 per cent.

Salaries for Clarenceville teachers at the first step in the scale will increase this year from \$8,500 to \$8,600, or nearly 1.2 per cent. Those at the top of the scale will receive 4.3 per cent increases from \$16,300 to \$17,000.

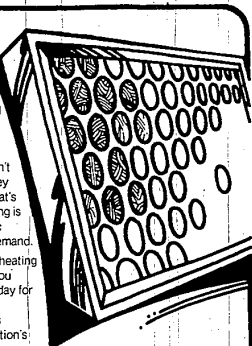
