Dear Parents and Citizens: Farmington teachers want to take this opportunity to express our heartfelt thanks for your patience and support during our most recent contractual difficulties with the Farmington Board of Edu-cation

The tentative Agreement which is presently under consid-eration by the respective parties represents a compromise of positions on the part of teachers and the Board of Education.

The new Agreement balls for a cap to be placed on the number of students enrolled in elementary classrooms. It further provides teachers with income protection, via application of a cost of living factor during the life of the Contract.

The tentative Agreement is three years in duration, a factor which should help heal any division resultant from the district's first teachers' strike. In this regard your teachers are committed to the immediate reconcilitation of past differences, and a steadfast focus on providing Farmington children with a superior instruc-tional program.

Again, we thank you for your concern, and look forward to working with you in the year ahead. tional program.
