



Nature Centers Invite Students

Teachers in schools located in Wayne, Macomb, Oakland, Livingston and Washtenaw counties now have an opportunity to stimulate their students' interest in studies which relate to the environment by arranging a scheduled class visit to one of three nature centers of the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority.

The HCMA nature centers include Stony Creek Metropark near Utica, Kensington Metropark near Milford and Lower Huron Metropark near Belleville, with information and appointments available by phoning HCMA headquarters at 600 Woodward Ave., Detroit.

A nature center appointment gives the class and teacher exclusive use of the exhibit room for a 45-minute session, including a short talk by a park naturalist who uses the exhibits and other natural objects to explain some of the interesting ecological relationships of the area.

When appointments are scheduled, teachers may suggest a lecture topic which is suited to the current classroom studies. "The Preparation of Plants and Animals For Winter" has often been a popular topic.

The nature centers at Stony Creek and Kensington Metroparks offer appointments starting daily at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, available both in the fall and winter.

At Lower Huron Metropark the nature center appointments start at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, available in the fall only.

No appointments are required for trail use, which are available daily 8 a.m. to dusk. Rules prohibit the collection of leaves and other objects in the park. Classes usually bring their own lunch, which can be enjoyed at nearby picnic areas since there are no indoor lunchroom facilities.

Court To Evaluate Plan For Closing Children's Center

Expert testimony will be taken in October in a court suit which challenges a new plan for care of retarded and emotionally - troubled children in Wayne County. The hearings will be before Circuit Judge Thomas Roumell.

The civil suit charges that the new plan might not provide quality care. The class action suit was filed on behalf of Local 832 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, and three children at the Wayne County Child Development Center and their parents.

Roumell's order that both sides present expert witnesses was issued at a show cause hearing.

Defendants in the case are the County Board of Commissioners, the State of Michigan, Gov. Milliken and Dr. E. Gordon Yudofsky, director of the State Department of Mental Health.

The new plan calls for creation of a central referral agency to place retarded and troubled children in community-based facilities, with the Child Development Center eventually being closed.

The plan was adopted by the commissioners in May upon recommendation of a joint state-county task force appointed by the governor at the request of County Board Chairman Robert E. Fitzpatrick.
