



In many countries there is no such thing as a bridal shower.

In the United States, it seems that most brides are given at least one -- and sometimes more -- of these affairs. Showers devoted to kitchen gadgets, lingerle and miscellaneous gifts are common.

The bar shower has become quite popular with guests helping the bride and groom to stock their wine and liquor cabinets. Very often these are coach affairs, moving these are co-ed affairs, moving away from the traditional all female showers.

IN THE PAST, showers were usually held at lunchtime, or in the early afternoon, but with most young women working today, a late afternoon or early evening affair is a wise choice. Whichever time of day you choose, a tea party is still one of the nicest settings for a shower.

- China teapot by rinsing with hot wa-
- Add_teabags_or_loose tea to the pot.
- Bring freshly drawn water to a rolling boil, then pour over the tea.

To extract full flavor from the tea leaves, let stand for length of time recommended on package and stir

before pouring.
In considering gifts for the bride-to-be, you might keep in mind the entertaining she'll be doing once she sets up her new home. With the increasing popularity of tea-drinking among people under thirty. chances are she'll be serving tea to many of her guests. She'll appreclate a pretty teapot, or tea set.

If you want to be less con-ventional, you might present her with an antique tea strainer or a tiny teaball for a single cup of tea. With any of these, a welcome addition would be a selection of fine teas.
