Motion for Partial and Immediate Rate Reliet which seeks authority, on an interim basis, to amend its gas rates so as to increase its gas revenues by approximately \$33,729,000 on an annual basis. On August 27, 1973, Consumers Power, Company also filed a Motion for Partial and Immediate Rate Relief in its pending electric rate proceeding, Case No. U.4332.
