Price, director of the Wash-tenaw County Department of Public Works, an engineering firm has been investigating various alternatives avail-able to the county for disposal of its solid waste. The study is in compliance with a state law requiring all impunicipalities of over 19.000 poundation to submit to state peals and the peals of the peals of

"At this point," Price sald, "the gathered information in-dicates the conversion of refuse to a 'salable fuel is a realistic possibility."

Price said the county could build a processing plant to convert the solid waste to fuel, to which local refuse trucks would then haul their loads.

At the processing plant, non-combustible wastes such as metal and gasts would be separated and perhaps sold for recycling.
