Department of State Highways. Re: Contract between Township of Plymouth and Michigan State Highway Commission with regard to modification of Township of Plymouth on West at Bridge Road. The following Resolution was offered by Russell Ash and supported by Frank Millington.

RESOLVED, that the Township of Plymouth approve the Contract between the Michigan State Highway Commission and the Township of

Plymouth, for the purpose of finding the rights and obligations of the parties in agreeing to the modification of the original contract. The agreement was signed at the crossing of Highway M-44 at Ridge Road within the limits of the Township and to further authorize the Supervisor, J. D. Harkin and the Clerk George L. Richardson to sign the Contract for the Township of Plymouth.

Resolution carried unanimously.

James E. Caspe, Jr., Sec. Of: Promotion of Charles VanVleet, Jr.

Honorable Men: Moved that the promotion of Charles VanVleet to Sec. IV be approved. Supported by Mr. Ash and carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION: MOTION: That the Township of Plymouth, Michigan, be authorized to sell the land on the south side of Ann Arbor Road at Haggerty, be added to the Agenda. Supported by: Mr. Millington and carried unanimously.

Minutes referred to the Committee on Finance. (Mr. Harkin from Marquette: Oil Company and signed by Robert N. Gaberman, Attorney, who stated that if they were to develop their service station on this parcel at this time and then later on for a commercial purpose, they would be in violation of the Township would find compatible with its plans, they still would only be

willing to convert \$20,000 of its share of the storm costs, which had been set at \$80,000, to a \$60,000 commitment. The town said it would not warrant or justify the requested \$40,000 commitment. They further said that they were sending copies of their letter to Bill Knapik and the Marlborough Board of Selectmen. Knapik said that he and his present storm sewer problem independent of Marlborough's role and its potential development. Mrs. Richardson further stated that due to the Township's unwillingness to assume the storm sewer problem, the Township is holding public hearings for its contractors. The Township should not hold up the Restoration's opening any longer, but should in fact, authorize the signing of the agreement to a satisfactory conclusion. She said that she was not sure the town stated that if the Township signed the agreement and in the future, they constructed the sewer, they would undoubtedly never get the money back from the town. However, she said that she was not sure if the town felt the Township should not hold up Bill Knapik's any longer. Mr. Overholt requested that the letter from Marlborough be made a part of the record and that the town should know the town is not aware of the people they were dealing with and that it was not the fault of the Township that Knapik's restaurant had

not been filed by 6/29/89.

On 6/29/89, the Township of Plymouth was offered by Elizabeth Holmes and supported by Gene Overholt:

RESOLVED, that the Township of Plymouth approve the agreement between the Township of Plymouth and the Wayne County Road Commission and the Township of Plymouth, covering storm water drainage on Ann Arbor Road and

Resolution carried unanimously.

Item No. 10:42: Offer Firemen Training Course and Item No. 10:43: Purchase of Fire Department Vehicle in DPMV grant, be tabled until the next regular meeting and that all members of the Township of Plymouth members prior to Mr. Overholt moving adjournment of the meeting. Unanimously by Mr. Burke.
