His sudden death at his retirement home in Florida shocked all who knew him as personnel manager at the defunct Metal Mouldings plant, manager of

the plant's hockey team for years, manager of the large racing stable owned by John Toner and C.P. Chamberlin, owners of Metal Mouldings, and then paddock judge at Northville Downs and assistant at Hazel Park and Wolverine Raceways.

It was just two years ago that "Big Pat" as he was best known to all his friends in deference to his daughter, Patricia, who became "Little Pat," retired to Florida with his spouse Betty.

Betty was a longtime employee in the mutual departments of the area thoroughbred tracks.

Although he had been ailing for the past several weeks, Pat appeared well on the road to recovery and was due for a final checkup Tuesday. But it wasn't to be... he died in his sleep early Tuesday morning.

The body was shipped to the Manns-Ferguson Funeral Home in Livonia where services were conducted Friday morning. The high esteem his friends and associates had for him was demonstrated by the hundreds who poured through the funeral home Thursday afternoon and evening.

All we could do was offer a prayer and say a silent goodbye to a good friend of 25 years who looked so well during a visit in January and again in early summer.

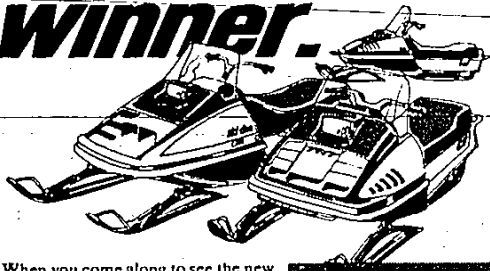
Surviving are: a son, Jack Paterson; a daughter, Mrs. Patricia Chapp; wife, Betty; five grandchildren and a brother.

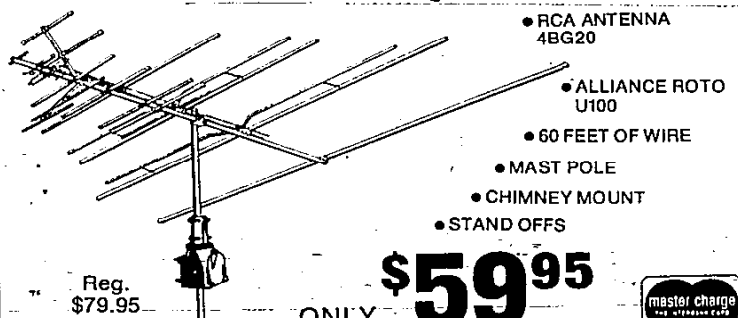
