Interested persons should contact the department of music, Oakland University, Rochester.

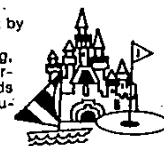
The chamber-size orchestra is in rehearsal for its first concert of the year, Oct. 26 at 8 p.m. in Varner Recital Hall.
