# Bridge Hand Beginning Lesson

Every once in a while, we get a complaint from one of our faithful readers (yes, we DO have faithful readers, Mr. Power!) to the effect that they enjoy our intermediate lessons just fine but couldn't we occasionally put in a deal especially for the rank beginners; well, fine, here it is, and it wouldn't hurt you better players to brush up a little ...

rubber bridge none vulnerable South deals

South, who had four or five bridge lessons and was therefore a qualified expert, had no trouble arriving at a reasonable 3NT contract; when the opening lead of the HJ hit the table and he surveyed the dummy, he remembered that the way to play this particular suit combination was to duck in dummy; besides, he thought, that would set up a 10th or 11th trick in the HQ.

So he ducked in dummy, East grabbed the HK and decided that there was little hope in attacking hearts so he switched to the S9 and all

of a sudden there weren't 10 or 11 tricks anymore ... there weren't even nine! For declarer's lone spade stopper was quickly dislodged and, when the diamond finesse lost, the inevitable spade return sunk the contract, but good!

Well, what was wrong with the play? Isn't that how to handle that suit but rather

Well, what was wrong with the play? Isn't that how to handle that combination of cards? Sure it is ... but the key here is not how to play the heart suit but rather how to play the whole deal! Just count slowly. Even if the diamond hook loses, there are 3 club tricks, 4 diamond tricks, and 2 major suit aces for nine; furthermore, if the diamond finesse loses to West, he cannot further attack hearts to advantage.

So declarer should have forgotten about extra tricks. He should've hopped up with HA in dummy, led a diamond, and chalked up his game; got that lesson, OK, all you beginners?
