

World Premiere Opens Redford Symphony Season

The Redford Civic Symphony will open its 17th season of performing for the Redford Township Music Society with a world premiere of Lee G. Noble's "Symphony No. 1 in C Major."

It is set for Sunday, Oct. 28, at 4 p.m. in Redford Union High School. John Gajec will conduct.

This represents Noble's first major work for a symphony orchestra. It took four

months to complete and he says of the music, "In this symphony I tried to create the nobility and perfection, as well as express the work as I see it, of the spirit of the 18th century classical symphony, as mainly represented by the composers like Haydn, Mozart and Beethoven."

In addition, the opening concert will highlight "The Villagers Musicians" for two

French horns by Mozart, featuring Dr. William Baker and Charles Marks as soloists.

The program also will include the overture to the operetta "The Beautiful Galathea" by Franz von Suppe and "Slavonic Rhapsody No. 2" by Carl Friedmann.

An afterglow tea will follow the concert. The Graham Civic Association and the Kenwood Women's Club invite the public to attend.
