Mrs. Frank said the fair was planned to raise money for a bus because "as our program continues to expand by leaps and bounds, so does our need for readily accessible transportation."

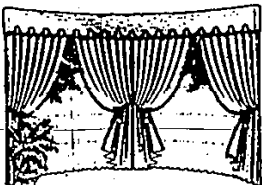
It would be used, she said, for camping programs in the summer, by after-school Y

Peggy Sucher of Needlepoint Unlimited will teach the four-week beginner class, open to both experienced and novice craftsmen.

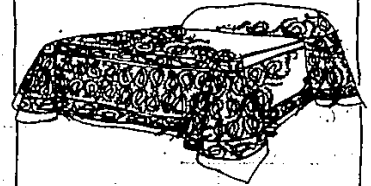
