# Plymouth Salem Guns For Title Tonight

Label this weekend's foot-

ball card the biggest for Plymouth football in almost 10 years.

The Suburban Eight championship clash, Plymouth Salem at Trenton High tonight

(Friday), kicks off at 8 p.m. Trenton, No. 3 team in the state, sports an overall 7-0 mark, 6-0 in the league, and Salem boasts a 6-1 record, 5-1 in the league.

This contest headlines an Observerland card of 15 games which includes two homecomings, Farmington at Southfield tonight and Thurston at Stevenson tomorrow (Saturday).

This afternoon's matches have Garden City East at Annapolis and Franklin at Churchill. The Franklin clash

is sure to prove a test in the Patriots' hopes for an undefeated season. The Chargers will get a real chance to see if they can bounce back from their first defeat after winning 15 straight.

At Trenton tonight, Plymouth Salem will tackle a team that outweighs them.

"We are definite underdogs," stated Plymouth Coach Tom Moshimer who has beaten Trenton only once in six seasons. The Rocks toppled Trenton two years ago, 27-18.

Granted, a win would only give the Rocks a share of the

crowns, but still it is a share of the championship. The last time Plymouth captured a football title was in 1963 when the league was then the Suburban Six.

Salem has scored 155 points and given up 62 in its seven games. Trenton has poured out 222 points and given up 72.

The two clubs, playing the identical six squads in the Eight, show Trenton holding the upper hand. They have scored 176 points in league play and have yielded only

Cec. Woodruff's Schoolcraft College soccer team rolled to a 4-1 victory over Henry Ford Community College last week to wrap up its second consecutive Michigan Community College Athletic Association (MCCAA) championship.

The Ocelots finished with a 5-0 record to take sole possession of first place. Last year, Woodruff's team shared the title with Macomb Community College.

Eddie Dabish, high-scoring Kamran Asdigha and Kerry Morgan tallied goals in the first half to give Schoolcraft a 3-0 lead at the midway point.

Artur Wyszynski tallied the fourth Schoolcraft goal at the 16-minute mark of the second half.

Woodruff is confident that the Ocelots will be tabbed to represent Michigan in the regional tournament of the national junior college soccer championship play-offs.

## Livonia Y Runners Set For Marathon

Max Nemazi and Jack Boyle, both members of the Livonia YMCA, are 'running proof' that middle aged men can become physically fit.

Nemazi at 47 and Boyle at

39, competed in the 26-mile, 385-yard Motor City Marathon at Belle Isle and both qualified for the Boston Marathon next April.

The race, nearly five times around Belle Isle, was run in 50 degree weather with a driving rain facing the runners most of the afternoon.

In the field of 140 starters, Boyle placed 16th of 40 in the 30-39 age group and 62nd overall in three hours and 16 minutes.

At three hours and 19 minutes, Nemazi was 70th overall and 13th of 29 in the 40-49 division.

Both runners are engineers at Detroit-Diesel Allison. They train at the Livonia Y by running 50 to 60 miles per week, eight to 10 miles a day and 20 on the weekends.
