## Projected Home Seeks Retardates

Retarded adults who would benefit from life in a new residential facility are being sought by the Community Opportunity Center Corp.

The non-profit group, affiliated with the Northwest Communities Association for Retarded Children, is in the process of developing a home for the retarded in Plymouth.

Its clients would live in the facility with the supervision of house-parents and would work in the community or in a sheltered workshop.

The home project will have facilities for 16 persons.

Parents of retarded adults capable of living in such a situation are urged to mail requests for information to Community Opportunity Center, 14834 Seminole, Detroit, 49239. Include name, address and telephone number.

All applications will be answered by a representative of COC.

The center organization said it was seeking clients now because the state re-

quires a list of potential residents of the planned facility.

Retardates who enter such a home would still be eligible for any benefits now in force, including social services, workshops, school and recreation.

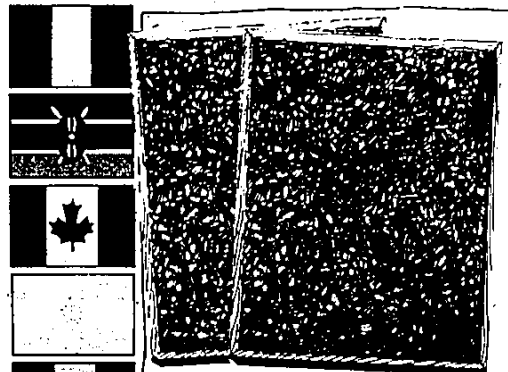
