and she carried sweetheart roses with stephanotis and baby's breath.

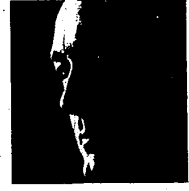
Dawn Secontine, maid of honor for her sister, wore a blue jersey gown and carried blue and yellow daisies and pink roses in a colonial bouquet.

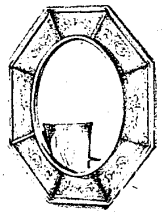

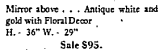

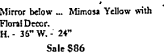
Mirror above ... Bone with gilt and Chippendale Decor.

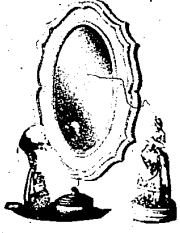
