

Police Make Marijuana Haul C'ville Seeks International Student Homes

SOUTHFIELD Southfield police had a busy day last Sunday, arresting four men in a big narcotics raid and three armed men in a separate arrest for residential burglaries.

In the raid, police confiscated 39 pounds of marijuana worth about \$12,000. Arrests were made in the

Howard Johnson Motel at 10 Mile and Evergreen.

Arrested were William Berry, 17, Christopher Robertson, 20, William Wheeler, 17, and Keith Habyan, 17, all from Florida.

They were apprehended by Patrolmen Loun Doan and William Soule who discovered the marijuana in 39 separate garbage bags.

Also confiscated were scales, three revolvers, a stereo, stereo tapes and a watch.

The suspects were arraigned Tuesday in 46th District Court and stood mute on charges of possession of marijuana and delivery of controlled substances.

Robertson and Wheeler were placed on \$25,000 bond, Berry on \$10,000 bond and Habyan \$5,000 pending preliminary examination Nov. 20.

Police responded at 2:19 p.m. Sunday to a complaint of burning marijuana in the Howard Johnson Motel. Officers smelled the odor in the hallway and narrowed it down to one room.

The suspects opened the door after officers knocked twice. One suspect attempted to escape through a sliding glass door wall exiting to the pool.

Three armed persons, two of them juveniles, believed to be responsible for six residential breaking and enterings in the city, were also arrested Sunday.

Timothy Wiesman, 17, of Detroit stood mute to charges of breaking and entering an occupied dwelling with intent to commit larceny. Bond was placed at

\$25,000 pending pretrial examination Nov. 19. The juveniles were turned over to juvenile court.

Patrolmen William Ulman and Stanley Domanick responded to a recorded alarm at a home on Mahon about 3 p.m. Sunday. They arrested three suspects armed with 38-cal. revolver, a 22-cal. automatic and an ice pick.

Police recovered \$1,800 in stolen property from the suspects' car. The property was taken from at least six homes in Southfield, police say.

The three are believed responsible for breaking and entering the home of Southfield Council President Steve Hurite last Friday.

The Clarenceville School District is in need of homes for South American students who wish to study in this country beginning in January.

The students would study here under auspices of the Youth for Understanding program.

Anyone who is interested in housing students is asked to contact Mrs. Sylvia Bartlett of 19825 Maplewood, Livonia.

Housing will be needed for two or three students.

An Ordinance to amend the Zoning Ordinance No. 29 of the City of Farmington Hills, as amended:

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains:

Section 1. That the Zoning map of said Ordinance No. 29 of the City of Farmington Hills, as amended, be amended by Ordinance No. 29-C-7 and the same is hereby amended to show D-Office Classification where RA-1 Classification is now shown in the area described in Rezoning Request #23-7-73: Lots 11, 12, 13 Lowercroft Subdivision part of SW 1/4 of Section 1, T. 1N., R. 9 E., Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan.

Section 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect Twenty-One (21) days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, at a regular meeting thereof duly called and held on the 12th day of November, 1973, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.






