means a different school tax in each.

In effect, township residents deduct their township millage from the school levy, while city residents pay the whole school tax.

The Farmington School District includes a small portion of West Bloomfield Township, which now levies 1.4 mills for operations.

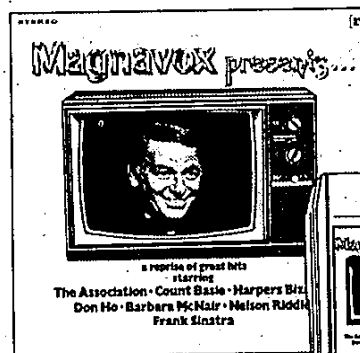

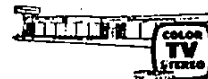
