Filled clothing bags picked up by the scouts will provide employment during the coming winter months for more than 200 handicapped employees of League For The Handicapped-Goodwill Industries.

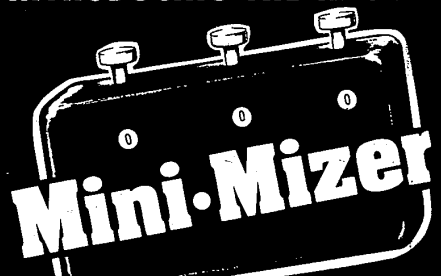

"All You Ever Wanted to Know about the Comet Kohoutek but Were Afraid to Ask" is the topic of a free public science program at Oakland University Monday, Dec. 3.

The 8 p.m. session in 190 Hannah Hall is sponsored by the department of physics. The program will provide background and viewing information on a comet that experts predict may be as large as any yet known.

By the end of November, the comet will become visible to the naked eye; by Christmas it could well be the brightest object in the sky, except for the sun and

moon; and by January it will probably sport a fanlike tail that will cover a sixth of the sky, physics department spokesman said.

This comet and others will be discussed in the OU program by physicist Norman Tepley, William Schultz, an astronomer from Cranbrook

Institute, will show slides and cover viewing possibilities and the comet's importance to astronomers. Charles Broth, English, will speak about the comet in history and the arts.

The Comet Kohoutek is named for its discoverer, Lubos Kohoutek.
