## Tax Challenge Response Good

**FARMINGTON**  
Response to a drive for a class action suit challenging a recent increase in school taxes is "very good," according to Joseph Alkateeb, who

is heading the drive for the suit.

Alkateeb is urging Farmington area residents to pay their school taxes "under protest" as a preliminary to filing the suit.

The Farmington school board formed a special task force last week at least partly in reaction to the threatened suit challenging the current Oakland County system of "differential millage."

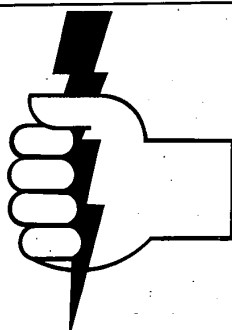
"We are not calling the tax illegal -- it is unconstitutional," Alkateeb said.

Alkateeb, treasurer of the Council of Homeowners, has had the aid of the association in distributing literature, but the council has not voted on whether to take a stand on the issue.

Alkateeb said if the suit is successful, only those who paid their taxes with a note indicating the 1.4 mills of school tax was paid under protest will get a refund.
