Are Offered**

FARMINGTON Free immunizations will be offered to all Oakland County children from three months of age through high school at the First Methodist Church of Farmington Thursday Dec. 13.

Hours will be 9 a.m. to noon. The church is at Warner and Grand River Avenues.

The free immunizations include either primary series or boosters for diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, polio measles (rubeola) and German measles (rubella) and tuberculin skin tests.

The same immunizations are offered at the South Oakland Health Department, 2775 Greenfield Rd., Southfield, from 8:30-11 a.m. and 1-4 p.m. Mondays through Fridays.

No appointment is necessary but previous immunization records should be brought in.
