Catastrophy Is Planned

PONTIAC
Eighteen Oakland County government agencies and other organizations will gather in Pontiac Dec. 6 to solve problems arising from a simulated catastrophic snowstorm.

The exercise will begin at 9:30 a.m. and end at 1 p.m. in a command post set up in

the Oakland County Law Enforcement complex.
The exercise was organized by the county office of disaster control and civil defense in conjunction with the emergency services division of the Michigan State Police and with Michigan Technological University.

"Purpose of the exercise is

to improve the ability of the county's governmental agencies to work effectively as a team in event of a major emergency," explains John A. Dent, director of the disaster control and civil defense office.

Paul E. Kasper (R - Bloomfield Hills), chairman of the board of county commissioners, will preside over the inter-agency task force in the emergency operations center of the disaster control unit on the lower floor of the Law Enforcement building which houses the sheriff's department.

Assisting in directing the exercise will be: Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson; Robert P. Allen, chief civil counsel; and Daniel T. Murphy, chairman of the board of auditors.

Participating county government agencies include the planning commission, road

commission, drain commission, DPW, health dept., Sheriff's dept., parks and recreation, social services, personnel, prosecutor's office, medical examiner, intermediate school district, county's central garage, child care institutions, and the Oakland - Pontiac airport.

Other participants include the Michigan National Guard, U.S. Weather Service, American Red Cross, Boy Scouts, Oakland County Radio Amateur Civilian Emergency Services (RACES), private hospitals and ambulance services, public utilities, and some local police and fire departments.

Critiques will be offered immediately upon completion of the exercise to identify and correct deficiencies which may appear.

**Sanctuary Given
\$74,000 Grant**

DETROIT
A \$74,000 grant has been awarded by the Office of Criminal Justice to "The Sanctuary," a pilot program to provide temporary shelter for Oakland County runaways.

The Law Enforcement Assistance Act grant will be added to \$20,000 already presented by the Junior League of Birmingham to The Sanctuary, along with commitments for in-kind services from Family Services of Oakland County and Catholic Social Services of Oakland County.

The idea of The Sanctuary

culminated extensive efforts by the Oakland Div. of United Community Services (UCS) of Metropolitan Detroit to fill a severe gap of a needed facility to handle young runaways on a crisis basis in Oakland County.

Program aim is to determine reasons for home truancy and to facilitate return of the young to their homes.

Other goals include referral to a professional when necessary, temporary or permanent foster-care placement for juveniles, a network of homes for the older adolescent who has reached age of majority, counseling and job education.

"The Sanctuary" will be for the 13 through 17 age group. Mark Berlier, a recent Oakland University graduate, is chairman of the board of directors which is presently looking for a suitable location for the facility.



DR. SAUL KRUGMAN, chairman of the pediatric dept. at New York University School of Medicine, will speak on "Recent Advances in Hepatitis" at William Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak, at 8 p.m. Monday, Dec. 10. At Breakfast**


WEST BLOOMFIELD
