Tickets may be purchased in advance from music students or at the door. Prices are \$1.25 for adults, 75 cents for students and a \$3 family ticket.

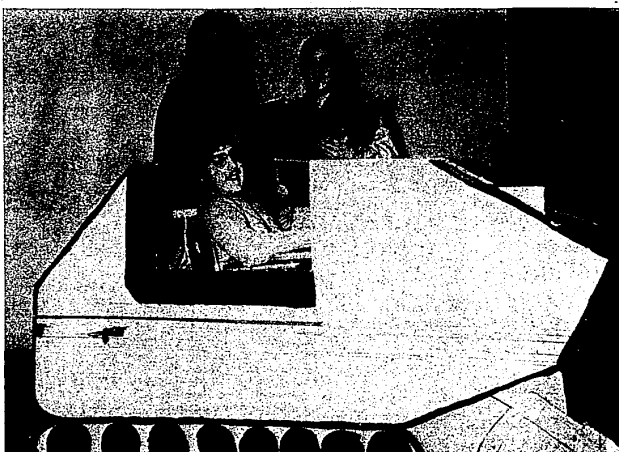
