### CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was held on Monday, December 3, 1973. Meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor Yoder.

ROLL CALL: Allen, Hartsock, Richardson, Tupper, Yoder present.

Absent: None

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Jones, Capt. Byrnes, Attorney Kelly, Clerk Viane.

Minutes of previous meeting were corrected to change "Motion by Yoder supported by Richardson, to close the nominations ..." to read "Motion by Tupper, supported by Richardson ... Minutes approved as corrected."

PUBLIC HEARING REVIEW SIDEWALK ASSESSMENTS

These assessments will be reviewed and a report submitted at the next Council Meeting.

Request from Hazel F. Quast Real Estate for variance to sign ordinance was denied.

Request from Mr. M. Powell and Gordon R. Vasseur to allow the north twelve feet of Lot No. 1 Resub of Brookdale to be added to the south side of Lot No. 2 Resub of Brookdale approved.

Letter received from Commissioner Mary M. Dearborn, Oakland County Board of Commissioners requesting Council support of a resolution regarding a distribution formula for road programs and jail boarding fees which she plans to introduce. City Manager Deadman will contact Commissioner Brotherton and indicate the approval and support of the Farmington City Council.

Request from Gary Garland, G & C Carpet Company, for variance of 2 1/2 ft. to the sign ordinance requirement for height limitations of ground signs was granted.

Request for permission to solicit funds in residential areas in the City of Farmington on December 8, 15-16, and 22-23, 1973 between 5:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M. by the Farmington Seventh-day Adventist Church, was granted.

Request from Mr. Aaron Holland, 22566 Lilac, for a review of the ordinance governing parking of commercial vehicles in residential areas was read and the Council referred the matter to the City Manager and the City Attorney for review and possible re-drafting of the ordinance.

PROGRESS REPORT ON IMPROVED LOCAL PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

City Manager Deadman reported that he had begun a study to determine present public transportation available within the community and an investigation of additional transportation systems that may be advantageous to the community. He found that to be eligible for state or federal funding in the area of transportation, the city must have the approval of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) since they are the only eligible authority within the Detroit Metropolitan Area that may receive State or Federal transportation funds.

City Manager Deadman will be meeting with SEMTA representatives in the near future to discuss the feasibility of improved transportation for Farmington. He will also contact the Suburban Cal Company to discuss methods of improving car service to our senior citizens during daylight hours.

A schedule of the present DSR and Greyhound service to the City of Farmington was presented to the Council.

PLASTIC GARBAGE CAN LINER BIDS

Motion by Hartsock, supported by Tupper, to award the bid for 150,000 plastic garbage can liners to the Bland Company, 2008 Ten Mile Road, Warren, Michigan, in the amount of \$4,115/cdn. for a total of \$617,250.

OAKLAND COUNTY EQUALIZATION REPORT CITY OF FARMINGTON

Farmington City Assessor, Dorothy Poston, will meet with the Oakland County Equalization Department in an effort to reduce the proposed 1.1% factor established by them for the City of Farmington for 1974.

CASUALTY AND LIFE INSURANCE FOR VOLUNTEER POLICE AND FIREFMEN

Motion by Tupper, supported by Richardson, to authorize the City Manager to purchase casualty and life insurance for the city's volunteer police and firemen in the same amount as provided for regular public safety officers, covering that period of time when they are on duty, from the Mutual of New York (MONEY).

AUTHORIZATION TO FILE FEDERAL GRANT WITH THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROGRAMS FOR A SATURATION PATROL

City Manager authorized to file, in conjunction with the City of Livonia and the City of Farmington Hills, a Federal Grant application with the Office of Criminal Justice Programs requesting the creation of a Saturation Patrol Unit with the city's share to be budgeted in the 1974-75 fiscal year budget.

The following appointments were made:

BOARD OF REVIEW: Bayard Tupper for 3 year term ending December, 1976.

BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS: John H. Richardson for 3 year term ending December, 1974.

BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE: Richard L. Tupper for 2 year term ending 1975.

RESOLUTIONS AND ORDINANCES

Motion by Allen, supported by Tupper, to adopt the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Special Assessment Roll for the construction of the 1973 Sidewalk Program has been reviewed by the City Council and that the City Council hereby determines that it is satisfied with the Special Assessment Roll prepared by the Assessor and presented to the City Council, and that said Special Assessment Roll is hereby confirmed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

1. That the first installment shall be due within 30 days from the date of confirmation (January 1, 1974).

2. That on the first day of March, 1974 a 4% collection fee will be added as prescribed by Charter under Section 11.7 - Collection Fees.

3. Payments may be made as follows:

\$100 or less will be due in full on January 3, 1974.

Assessment of \$101.00 or more may be paid in installments with 6% interest on the unpaid balance as follows:

\$101.00 to \$200.00 2 equal installments

\$201.00 to \$300.00 3 equal installments

\$301.00 to \$400.00 4 equal installments

Over \$400.00 5 equal installments

(First installment due January 3, 1974; subsequent installments due July 1st each year)

Monthly Bills submitted as of December 3, 1973 approved for payment. In the amount of \$9,962.39 General Fund and \$1,900.97 Water & Sewer Fund.
