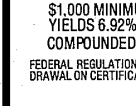

## New Chance In Busing Case?

His lawyer dispelled any doubts in the minds of Clarenceville school board members as to the worth of filing a friend of the court brief (amicus curiae) before the Supreme Court of the United States in the Detroit School Desegregation Case.

Attorney John Shantz prompted a unanimous vote by the board to spend not more than \$1,000 to join the Michigan Hills School District in a move which essentially "will get the court's ear" in the Bradley et al vs. Milliken et al case.

Clarenceville along with a number of other districts—such as Bloomfield Hills and West Bloomfield—has never appeared as a party to the Detroit school desegregation case, although it is included within the "desegregation area" adopted by the District Court on June 14, 1972.

In urging the board's approval, Shantz explained that "the idea is that the non-intervening districts occupy a unique position. If there is a representative number of the outlying districts, it will direct the attention of the court to the overall size of the problem."

It is an attempt to try to educate the court as to what Michigan education is all about," Shantz continued. "Bloomfield Hills is prepared to go it alone but would prefer other communities to join them."

Supl. David B. McDowell also urged the Board to vote to join the friend of the court brief. "I feel that the people of our community need to know what we are doing in their behalf," McDowell stated. "I feel it's to our advantage to join this ball game."

The Clarenceville School District has been approved for a grant of \$35,500 from the state Department of Education.

The funds will be used to finance experimental and demonstration centers for the budget period of Aug. 1, 1973 through July 31, 1974 under Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA).

People from all over the state make appointments to view Clarenceville's reading systems program. The funds will ensure continuation of the demonstrations.
