

Learning Exchange To Start At SC

The Newman Association, which serves Schoolcraft College and the campus community, will launch a "Life-Learning Exchange" early in 1974.

The exchange is designed to provide an opportunity for people to share their participation in one of three levels. One level is that of a person wishing to share an interest with other people. A second level would be as a resource person or teacher. The third level is that of a student interested in learning.

The on-campus case collecting for the exchange will be conducted between Jan. 2 and 11. However, as an ongoing project the collection will begin in the community after Jan. 11.

Persons may react to suggestions or propose their own through an idea Bank, which is a large box which will be located at various places on campus, including the auxiliary gym during registration Jan. 2 and 3.

The idea Bank will be moved to various locations within the community after Jan. 11. Proposals may also be made by calling an exchange central after Jan. 11.

An interest survey containing more than 200 ideas for the Life-Learning Exchange will appear on a check-off form available at the idea Bank. Persons are not limited to these topics and may choose their own.

Some examples of interest areas include acupuncture, beer making, bonsai tree cul-

tivation, Ukrainian egg decorating, etc. - a sketch, harmonica, men's consciousness-raising, shabshuchi, and wilderness survival skills.

When submitting the check-off form an individual will enter the Life-Learning Exchange on one of three levels. One level is that of a person wishing to share an interest with other people. A second level would be as a resource person or teacher. The third level is that of a student interested in learning.

The establishment of the exchange is a project of the Newman House staff, with Judy Kaitz serving as project coordinator.

"Hopefully, participation will interest and involve many within our campus community," Miss Kaitz said.

Free Wood Available From State

There's plenty of free firewood for the taking in Michigan state forests, parks, recreation areas and game areas, reports Department of Natural Resources.

The permit procedure helps the DNR control the amount and variety of timber taken from state lands, as well as assuring that timber removed is not already "spoken for" and that no person takes more than he needs to meet his own heating requirements. Timber retrieved under the free permit program may not be sold.

Fuel - wood is most abundant in the expansive forested tracts of the northern lower peninsula and upper peninsula, with a limited amount on hand in southern lower peninsula state parks, recreation areas and game areas. Those wanting permits in northern Michigan should contact northern area foresters or park managers.

Those wishing to comb state park, game or recreation area land in the southern lower peninsula for firewood should contact park or game managers there.
