BEFORE YOU BUY


- Choose only toys appropriate for the child's age and development. Many toys now have age group labels on the package.
- Look for warning labels on toys, such as "Not Intended for Children Under 3 Years of Age," Remember/that young children may be able to get their hands on toys designed/for their older brothers and sisters once the toy has been brought home.
- Certain toys should be bought only for older, mature children. These toys include chemistry sets and electrically-operated toys, particularly those producing heat.
- Check fabrics for "non-flammable," "flame-retardant," or "flame-resistant" labels, Other labels to look for are "washable" and "hygienic materials" notices on stuffed toys and dolls.
- Do not buy toys such as shooting games, especially those involving darts and arrows, unless they will be played ONLY under parental supervision. Avoid toys that produce excessive noise.

- Teach your child the proper use of toys. Be sure that instructions accompanying toys are easy to read and understand.
- Supervise the play of young children, There is no substitute for parental interest and supervision. Remember that any toy, can be dangerous if
- Check your children's toys periodically. They may develop potential hazards such as sharp points, jagged edges, or loose small parts.
- Dan't leave indoor toys outdoors overnight. Moisture can damage them, Check outdoor toys and games also for potential hazards. Remember that rusting can weaken metal parts.

TOYS FOR THE VERY YOUNG SHOULD BE CHOSEN WITH EXTRA CARE

- 10 When choosing a toy for an infant or small child, select one that:
 - ...is too large to be swallowed
 - ..does not have detachable small parts that can lodge in the windpipe,
 - ... is not apt to break easily into small pieces or leave jagged edges.
 - ...does not have sharp edges or points.
 - ...has not been put together with straight pins, sharp wires, nails, etc., that might be easily exposed.
 - ...is not made of glass or brittle plastic
 - ...is labeled "non-toxic." Avoid painted toys for infants who put playthings in the mouth.
 - ...does not have parts that can pinch fingers or toes, or catch hair.
 - ...does not have cords or strings over 12 inches in length.
