## Lake St. Clair Perch Spearing Given Go-Ahead

LANSING — Lakes and connecting waters include the sauger, the splake, Atlantic, coho, chinook and pink salmon; northern pike except during January and February; muskellunge except during January and February on Lakes Superior, Michigan, Huron and the St. Marys River; and sturgeon except during February.

Another new regulation prohibits taking of sturgeon of less than 50 inches long from all Michigan waters. The new sturgeon limit-up from 42 inches will allow female sturgeon to mature before reaching legal size, say DNR fish biologists.

The action will reduce slightly the number of sturgeon taken from the upper peninsula's Menominee River, they say, but will double the weight of sturgeon taken from the river. Biologists believe the low limit will have little effect on the famous Cheboygan County sturgeon population because sturgeon speared in those waters traditionally have been at least 50 inches long.

## 16-Year-Old Is Killed

SOUTHFIELD — A Livonia man is being held for the stabbing death of Alan Goodman, 16, of Farmington, on New Year's Day in Southfield.


Ronald Oster, 26, of Livonia, is being held without bond on an open charge of murder. The stabbing took place about 1:15 a.m. Jan. 1 during a party in the home of Fred Kohn on Jeanette St., Southfield.

The Kohns were away and a daughter was giving the party.

Southfield Police report a fight had started after the two men had words. Oster reportedly pulled a knife and stabbed Goodman two or three times in the chest.

Goodman was rushed to Providence Hospital, Southfield, for emergency surgery but died in the hospital.
