



LT. TOM BORKOWSKI

Father Borkowski is Navy chaplain

"Father Tom," Our Lady of Loretto's young pastor for more than four years, now is Lt. Thomas Borkowski of the U.S. Navy.

He recently completed chaplain school in Boston and is serving in the U.S. Naval Hospital in Oakland, Calif.

He decided on the move af-

ter a satisfying first pastorate in the Redford Township Catholic parish because "basically I was looking for a new challenge - a new way to serve and grow as a priest and as a person.

"In talking with men in vice," Lt. Borkowski said before heading for California, "I realized there is a real need on their part for someone to talk to.

"And I like the ecumenical nature of the chaplain's work. I'll be serving Catholics, of course, but others too, helping provide for religious needs and serving as a counselor and a friend to all who need me."

Lt. Borkowski, a native of Wyandotte, went to high school and college at St. Mary of Orchard Lake and then on to seminary at St. John in Plymouth.

He found the eight weeks in chaplains' school as varied and intensified as any training he has had.

"There was the indoctrination into the Navy and Marines, of course," he said, "but also a wide variety of other experiences.

"We had seminars at Boston University on racism and on the young adult, trying to understand better his approach to life and to God. There was also a seminar on dope addiction and how the chaplain can help a serviceman or woman who has become dependant on drugs."

The course also included an evening in a commune and a visit to Roxbury, the slum area of Boston.

Then there was a night and day in prison at Portsmouth, N.H., - "we were treated as prisoners, by our consent" -- and a week on the destroyer USS Cecil.

"I was with a group of re-



servants from Detroit and most of us were seasick," Lt. Borkowski admitted.

He also had a chance to try out, on land, the "Holy Helo" lift the Navy uses to transport chaplains from one ship to another by means of a harness dangling from a helicopter.

In the Oakland hospital, which is basically for the treatment of psychiatric and orthopedic patients, he will be part of a five - chaplain team.

"I want to be someone who listens - helps these people resolve conflicts."


