House committee's probe into school drug use continues

The use of behavior - controlling drugs in the schools will be the subject of a public hearing in Detroit on Monday, Jan. 21, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Community Arts Auditorium, State Fair Grounds.

The hearing has been scheduled by the Special House Committee on Behavior Controlling Drugs. State Rep. Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park), committee chairman, said: "The purpose of this committee is largely to investigate the use, or abuse, of drugs such as Ritalin in schools to induce behavior conformity in children."

"At this point, we have not proposed legislation; it is entirely possible that no legislation will come out of these hearings."

The special committee was originally formed to investigate complaints by parents in some school districts that they had been pressured by school personnel to have a hyperactive child put on medication.

Forbes said it is important that parents wishing to testify understand that the committee cannot concern itself with the question of whether it is proper that behavior controlling drugs be prescribed for schoolchildren. The decision to prescribe or not prescribe rests entirely with the physician and the parents, he said.

HFCC enrolling for spring

Enrollment tickets are available for the spring semester at Henry Ford Community College, 5101 Evergreen, Dearborn.

Purchase of the enrollment tickets gives a person a definite appointment hour and date in which to register for spring classes during the regular registration period, Jan. 29 to Feb. 11.

"The sooner a person buys his enrollment ticket, the earlier he will be able to register for spring classes and the more likely it is that the person will get the class he wants when he wants it," said Wallace B. Smith, dean of student personnel services.

The enrollment ticket fee is \$5 for persons who enroll in daytime classes. The ticket is \$1 for each evening or weekend college class.

Present students and former students are allowed to buy their enrollment tickets before registration appointments are assigned to persons who have never been enrolled at HFCC.

Enrollment tickets are available in the main lobby of the Administration Building and are not available by mail.

Fitness class

Older adults and retirees will be swimming, exercising and running laps in a course entitled "Fitness After Fifty" offered at Schoolcraft College this winter.

The class meets three times a week for eight weeks. A class in adult swimming also will be offered three afternoons a week for eight weeks and include instructional swimming for the beginner or experienced swimmer.

Pre-retirement planning set

A course to help persons plan the transition from working to retirement will be offered at Schoolcraft College and will meet eight Tuesday evenings beginning Feb. 19.

The community services class offers pre-retirees the opportunity to meet with others who want to examine issues which must be considered in planning life in the later years.

Metropark fee plan explained

The Huron - Clinton Metropolitan (Park) Authority reminds area citizens that the \$1 parking charge at four of its nine Metroparks doesn't start until May.

James J. Pompo, deputy director, stated that at the present time parking charges will apply to only Metropolitan Beach near Mt. Clemens, Stony Creek Metropark near Ulua and Kensington Metropark near Milford and tentatively to Lower Huron Metropark near Belleville.

When charges begin, the fee will be \$1 daily per vehicle, with a reduced rate for frequent visitors of five coupons for \$1 and a senior citizen rate of five coupons for \$2.50. Re-entry permits will be available for parents and/or patrons who drop off children or other visitors at the toll gate. This would be one charge for the patron per day.

Excluded from the parking fees are: Hudson Mills, Dexter - Huron and Delhi Metroparks, near Ann Arbor, Willow Metropark near New Boston and Marshbank Metropark near Pontiac.

Public transportation, scheduled buses, bicyclists and walk-in visitors will be admitted free. Scheduled buses are those that have hoisted the park in advance of their visit, generally day camp, recreation or senior citizen groups.

Parking charges will be in effect May through September.

Pompo stated that several "operational - administrative" details concerning the new Metropark parking charges are not finalized, but additional information will be available in the spring.
