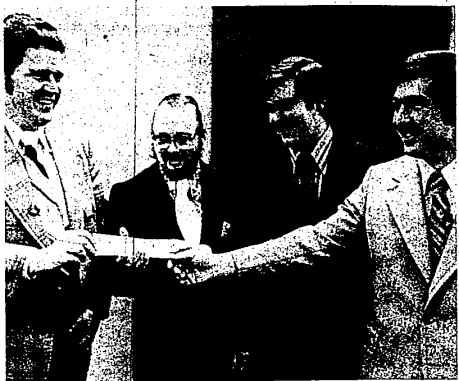

Concert features famous organist

Organ virtuoso Virgil Fox will be the guest soloist Sunday, Jan. 20, at 3:30 p.m. when the Detroit Symphony Orchestra offers its third Kregea "OmniBus" Family Concert of the season in Ford Auditorium.

Guido Ajmone-Marsan, winner of the first Georg Solti competition for conductors last spring, will be on the podium to conduct Beethoven's Overture to "Fidelio" and Franck's Symphony in D minor.

Fox will present an organ demonstration before a capacity afternoon audience and appear with the orchestra in Joseph Jongen's Symphonie Concertante for Organ and Orchestra, a work he last performed with the Detroit Symphony in 1960.

Formerly the organist at New York City's Riverside Church for 19 years, Fox has earned his greatest renown in the concert and recording fields. He has appeared as soloist with the nation's leading orchestras as well as having played three request recitals at the White House.

Most recently, he has combined an all-Bach program of organ music and a rear-projection light show to create "Heavy Organ," a presentation which launched what he describes as "a love affair with the youth of this country and Johann Sebastian Bach."

Italian born Guido Ajmone-Marsan will be making his Detroit Symphony conducting debut at next Sunday's concert, which is sold out.
