Obscenity ordinance passes Hills council

FARMINGTON A local ordinance giving Farmington Hills the power to enforce last year's U.S. Supreme Court ruling on obscenity was adopted 6-1 by the Farmington Hills council Monday.

"The Supreme Court says the language must be specific," Joseph T. Brennan, city attorney, said.

"It almost makes the ordinance obscene."

The ordinance makes it illegal to "sell, give, provide,

loan, rent, trade, dispense" obscene materials, or to deliver, transmit or send them.

In defining obscenity, Brennan used the Supreme Court definition: "if the average person applying contemporary community standards would find that the material, taken as a whole, appeals to the prurient interest, and if the material, taken as a whole, lacks serious literary, artistic, political or scientific value."

Material which could be judged under the ordinance

includes any containing nudity or "explicit language."

"This would not prohibit the sale of Playboy," Brennan said. "It would prohibit the sale of a stag film."

"The majority of cases would fall somewhere in between."

Councilman Joan Dudley asked "who would ask the police to make an arrest under this ordinance?"

Brennan said, "Our office."

He added ultimately the decision on whether or not material is obscene would be

up to a judge or a jury.

Councilman William Ortmann, the lone dissenter, objected to the stiff penalty "for a college kid caught with a smoker" of up to \$500 and 90 days in jail.

Brennan said this is the standard penalty, and could be levied "for a parking ticket."

The city of Farmington passed an obscenity ordinance last spring, without the specific language, but including the "contemporary standards" phrase.

Lichtman is critical of Hills mayor's role

FARMINGTON Signs of a political break in the Farmington Hills council surfaced Monday when Councilman Frederick Lichtman challenged Mayor Robert McConnell's handling of the chairmanship.

"I don't want to be a rubber stamp, with everything greased and ready," Lichtman said after McConnell

referred to "delicate negotiations" taking place over the paving of Gill Rd.

Lichtman objected to McConnell "reporting" to the council and accused him of unilaterally representing the city at a recent hearing on Northwestern Highway without contacting the rest of the council.

"I'm sorry it came out this

way," Lichtman said, "but I don't need you to tell me in a condescending manner about delicate negotiations."

McConnell said little in reply, but said the meeting, Lichtman referred to was called at the last minute.

When Lichtman objected to a status report "coming from the mayor," McConnell said "that status report is from the city manager."

FAAC director last May, and John Strokamp, his program coordinator, both hold degrees of master of social work from the University of Michigan.

Dainiani worked in the field of mental health in Ann Arbor before joining FAAC, primarily in the areas of prevention, referral and consultation. He served as a

therapist and police consultant.

Strokamp was with the Detroit public health department working at alleviating the dangers of lead poisoning to children of the inner-city.

Coordinator of the Outreach Clinic will be Mrs. Carol Duggan, a registered nurse.

As envisioned, the clinic will be open on Monday and Wednesday evenings for four hours each. It will be staffed by one paid physician who has accepted the post of medical consultant and 10 volunteer doctors who will donate their time on a rotating basis.

The nurse-coordinator will be responsible for the medical clinic administration assisted by nine volunteer workers.

"An essential function will be to maintain a cooperative relationship with the public health department," Dainiani said.

"Using this relationship as a bridge, patients will be referred to public health for venereal disease and pregnancy testing, immunization and other related services."

Clinic staff will be responsible for establishing and maintaining liaison relationships with other elements of the health care delivery sys-
